


Get involved with the chamber - new members sought

Lex the Barber to set up shop

Watch for a new business in Rio Dell - Lex the Barber signed a lease at 220 Wildwood and hopes for a soft opening at the start of December. His head is full of dreams about how he will extend his signature barbering experience - pampering his customers, evoking memories of an earlier time, and providing an environment in which people can feel safe, and at home, no matter who they are.

Alex Calderon, as he is also known, chats from the Scotia home he shares with two dogs and not much furniture. He is putting everything he has into his dream, which he came to when a former neighbor spoke to him about cosmetology school and set him on the career path which launched him in many new directions. "I want to barber 12 hours a day," he said of the joy it brings to connect with customers, and the response they provide to his care, for instance saying that the smells and experience he provides (for now he is working at 4Ever Faded, a shop on F Street in Eureka) take them back to memories of childhood.



Calderon is drawn not just to providing a positive, sensory experience ("some people don't feel human touch otherwise," he notes, and find they crave the contact involved in barbering) but to serving special-needs populations. Those include veterans at the annual October Stand Down at the fairgrounds in Ferndale, where he offers free haircuts, and children on the autistic spectrum, whom he provides for in a special room he calls his personal studio, which he built with his tip money, using quieter clippers and care that helps them overcome their objection to the experience.

He has learned to work with these young clients with help from their parents, to identify the barriers the children run up against in getting a traditional haircut, and finding ways around them. His barbering studio features soft music from the Big Band era, an array of toys including an expansive Hot Wheels collection, and the barbering chair he calls the Delorean, indicating a poster on the wall featuring the car in the movie Back to the Future.

Calderon moved to Scotia in 2008 from his native Southern California, and at 48 years old, has worked in many careers, including a security business, firearms training, real estate and wine sales. After a divorce, he headed to San Francisco looking for a new direction but returned to the area, and credits Sarah Reback, coordinator of the Community Resource Center in Rio Dell, with providing him a lot of help and information about services that could benefit him. Out of appreciation, the resource center is one of the places he visits when he has spare time, to provide free haircuts to people with special needs. Plans include expanding his repertoire of skills to help others, by visiting facilities such as hospitals and nursing homes to gather information about working with their populations. continued on page 4



Calderon is quick to say he owes his success to others, which is why he is eager to give back. "Your tax dollars put me through school," he tells people when he offers his services for free. He speaks of hard times he has known, depression and hunger, when he went to food pantries, and slept in his car. He also speaks of God and faith, determination and hard work. "If it were easy we would all have it," he says of meeting one's goals.

"I was able to get a \$15,000 grant to go to barbering school," he says, from the Department of Rehabilitation due to his having post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD). He attended Frederick and Charles Beauty College in Eureka, a nine-month training program he completed in seven months, because he was determined and went all-in to learn. "I can do women's hair, children's," he says of his training.

Calderon expects to start the new shop with one chair but envisions expanding as he builds up clientele, where he can hire others, another way of giving back. He owns a trailer that he is considering turning into a mobile barber shop to take to other communities. "I'm an ambitious entrepreneur," he says, and believes someday he will own several shops. In the meantime, he wants to make his new shop welcoming.

He plans to call the new business Neighborhoods Barber Shop, pointing out he will serve many neighborhoods, from Scotia and Rio Dell out to Shively and beyond. The building has 12-foot ceilings, and he smiles as he envisions the décor, with Frank Sinatra on the sound system and a bench outside where people can sit and talk. The bus stop is right outside, he notes. His dogs, a French bulldog and her son, a French-English bulldog cross, will be there.

He sees talk as important in his service to clients – "it's cheap therapy," he says, and his goal is to encourage people of all walks of life to find a safe space to speak their truth. Being able to laugh with others about their differences is a goal, he says, that he can combine with his barbering. "Life is hairy – you don't have to be," he smiles.
